Concert Bands

Concert Band Red & Concert Band White – *no audition required*

- Perform four concerts, Band-O-Rama and solo night or Solo/Ensemble Festival
- Work with guest conductors & composers

Symphonic Band - *audition required*

- Perform four concerts, Band-O-Rama and solo night or Solo/Ensemble Festival
- Work with guest conductors & composers
- Sectionals during Cardinal 30
- Spring Tour
- Private Lessons encouraged

Wind Ensemble - *audition required*

- Perform four concerts, Band-O-Rama and solo night or Solo/Ensemble Festival
- Work with guest conductors & composers
- Sectionals during Cardinal 30 or before school
- Spring Tour
- Private Lessons encouraged
- Some extra rehearsals outside of school may be scheduled
- This band may receive invitations for special events, festivals, or music conventions

Band Co-Curricular Activities

Participation in Concert Band allows students to also participate in *Jazz Ensembles*, *Epoch Sound Pep Band* and the *Sound of Sun Prairie Summer Marching Band*.

Additional Band or Music Classes

Instrumental Chamber Music

Semester long course where students explore the music and process of chamber music (duets, trios, quartets & quintets). Create their own arrangements. Develop their communication and interpretive skills in a small setting. In this class everyone is the conductor and members of groups work collaboratively to understand the perspective of each musician and balance those perspectives into a cohesive whole. It is creating in small groups.

Musical Improvisation

Semester long course where explore improvisation from a classical and jazz perspective. Students will engage in creating within a small group setting. Exploring affective techniques and choices. What sounds make us feel certain responses and how can those sounds be used to communicate ideas in improvised music. How can ideas be organized into effective musical communication.

Music Theory

Semester long class designed for students interested in music writing fundamentals, developing sight singing, musical analysis, and harmony.

Music in the Mainstream

Semester long class for students interested in learning popular music styles. In this class students play drums, pianos and ukuleles. Audio technology will be used to create loop-stations, online sampling, and music notation.

Sun Prairie High School Wind Ensemble & Symphonic Band Auditions

Register for your current band class (9th grade students should register for concert band) and we will have Student Services adjust schedules after auditions.

Auditions will take place the week before spring break.

Audition Requirements for *Wind* Players

1. Play concert C, F, Bb, Eb, Ab, Db, Gb, B, E, A, D & G major scales ascending (played up the scale but not down) from memory - Musician's may earn additional credit for performing multiple octaves of any scale
2. Play a chromatic scale from the musician's lowest possible note to the highest possible note from memory
3. Section of a solo of the musician's choice
4. Short sight-reading exercise

Audition Requirements for *Percussion* Players

1. Play concert C, F, Bb, Eb, Ab, Db, Gb, B, E, A, D & G major scales ascending (played up the scale but not down) from memory
2. Snare drum etude on the percussion audition sheet (see your band director for the sheet) **
3. Mallet etude on the percussion audition sheet (see your band director for the sheet) **
4. Short sight-reading exercise on snare drum and mallets

**Percussionists may substitute a solo from solo/ensemble for the corresponding audition etude. For example, a snare drum solo may be performed in place of the snare drum audition etude.
