

All of the bands did good work in preparation for the first concert. The fall is always a time of reviewing fundamentals and learning how to budget our time to fulfill our commitment to the other members of our ensemble – we are much closer to that ideal than we were just a few weeks ago.

The **Pit Orchestra** is working hard for their shows November 13-15 and 20-22 and all students will soon be selecting solos/and ensembles for February. Come and see *Peter Pan* if you can!

Wednesday, October 28 - UW - River Falls Wind Ensemble - All Band Classes 9am - 12:30pm

The **UW-River Falls Wind Ensemble** presented a concert to band classes, featuring composer **Jack Stamp** (Composer of "Gavorkna Fanfare" that the SPHS Wind Ensemble performed at our first concert) for all bands. These performances will be in preparation for the ensemble's performance at the Wisconsin State Music Convention.

Monday, November 30, 7pm - UW-Eau Claire Jazz I with SPHS Jazz I & II

Bob Baca and the **UW-Eau Claire Jazz Ensemble I**, with SP Alum Sam Olson on Bass, will present a **public concert** with SPHS Jazz I and II in the SPHS PAC. The concert will cap a day of clinics at the high school with all three jazz ensembles.

Speaking of funds, **Fund-raising** is in full swing (Bucky Book sales actually just concluded) — with opportunities for working **concession events at UW sporting events**. The **Fruit Sale** has begun and is a tradition here in Sun Prairie. Forms are available from your son or daughter's band director. Every band student will be going "on tour" this year, with a cost of around \$100 (and \$250 for Wind Ensemble), so fundraising through concessions is a great way to meet others who share your sons or daughters' interest in music while defraying the cost of a trip or a summer camp or Sound of Sun Prairie. Saturday, December 5, Big Band Dance -AT ANGELL PARK PAVILION

Events and Volunteer Opportunities for Jazz

1) Saturday, December 5, Big Band Dance

2) Saturday February 20 - "Essentially Ellington" Jazz Festival



This is a huge, annual event for the jazz program which features HS bands from around Wisconsin (usually around 12 bands). This is an all-day event, going from ~7:00 in the morning and ending with an evening concert. This event requires considerable help/time from jazz parents and is a major fund raiser for our organization, in addition to being a great educational event for the kids. The festival is a competition, with judges, but also includes clinics with jazz educators and professionals and ends with a concert and awards. Several scholarships are given out to students for summer jazz programs. We typically need 40-60 volunteers to help with this event in various capacities (office work, hallway monitor, running the judges' hospitality suite, organizing, cooking and serving ~320 people lunch). Beginning in January we will start requesting help with this event.

3) April 5 Spring Jazz Concert

This is a standard jazz concert, with all of the SPHS jazz bands performing several songs.

4) Swing Into Spring - March 12

Swing Into Spring includes all of the jazz bands and is held at one of the middle schools.

5) Essentially Ellington Jazz Competition in NYC

For the past several years, Jazz I has submitted an audition CD to the Essentially Ellington Jazz Competition, put on by the Jazz at Lincoln Center for High School Jazz bands all over the country. The top 10 bands are selected to go to NYC and compete at Lincoln Center. SPHS Jazz I has been selected to compete in NYC several times, most recently in 2015. The recording for the audition CD occurs in January and the band finds out in late February if they are finalists and are invited to NYC. If selected, the jazz program has just a few weeks to raise the funds to send the band. We try to raise enough money that we only have to charge the students a nominal amount.

All jazz students will attend a jazz festival at some time during the school year. Parents may do fundraising through the Band Boosters (working concessions, selling fruit and Bucky Books, etc.) to offset their child's costs for these and other events.

The goal of assessment is to provide feedback to the student, teacher, parents, and other stakeholders. Research has shown that students who practice self-reflection and self-analysis do better and accomplish more. Our goal is to provide students the opportunity to practice self-reflection and self-analysis while receiving feedback from their teachers. This process will also provide you with a multifaceted report on student progress. These reports will be sent to you in the form of a PDF once per quarter and will give you more information than what you will see in their official grades.


- 1. Individual skills Demonstrates appropriate skills and techniques in small group settings (lessons).
- 2. Ensemble skills Demonstrates appropriate skills and techniques in large group settings.
- 3. Imagination, Creativity, Composition, Improvisation & Innovation Develop the powerful skills of divergent thinking.
- 4. Literacy Read, Write, Listen, Speak and Think
- 5. Analysis & Evaluation Respond to music through analysis and evaluation
- 6. Connections Demonstrate connections between art, cultures, history, community, and self.
- 7. Building Myelin Demonstrate goal-oriented practice, practice strategies, and self-evaluations.

Charms, our accounting system, lists the student's legal name (the name the school has on file). When the Treasurer enters a name it is importing from the school district. It does not recognize shortened names or nicknames.

Example: Kat Jones, is that Kathy Jones, Katherine Jones or Kathryn Jones. The Treasurer wants to ensure the correct student gets the credit.

- 1. Ledger balances can be found on CHARMS charmsoffice.com
- 2. Ledgers are to be used within the fiscal year they are earned, no later than August 1st of the preceding school year.
- 3. All Student Ledger funds not used within the fiscal year, are transferred to SPBB General Fund on August 1 of following fiscal year.
- 4. Requests for use of Student Ledgers for below items require a 2 week notice to the treasurer (<u>treasurer@spbb.org</u>) in order to properly process the information and write a check, unless otherwise noted.
- 5. All **field trip requests** must have a printed statement from CHARMS showing the student's balance and the amount you would like to use from the ledger. Please staple this statement to the permission slip.

 - c. If you do not attend the Honors camp, you need to reimburse boosters the cost of the camp.

7. Private Lessons

- a. Lesson teachers must be SPASD Band Director approved
- b. Maximum of \$1,000 use per school year (October 1 and paid out by August 1)
- c. 2 weeks before payment is needed, log into CHARMS, and confirm your ledger balance covers the cost of lessons and then email treasurer@spbb.org with your request to use the student ledger to pay the private teacher.
- d. Check is made out to private lesson teacher and can be picked up from CHUMS band director, Ian Melrose (<u>ipmelro@sunprairieschools.org</u>)

8. Band Lesson Academy

- a. Lesson teachers are SPASD Band Director approved.
- b. Maximum of \$1,000 use per fiscal year(October 1 and paid out by August 1)
- c. 2 weeks before payment is needed, log into CHARMS, and confirm your balance covers the lessons and then email lessonacademy@spbb.org with your request to use the student ledger to pay for Band Lesson Academy lessons.

- 1. Print the statement
- 2. Indicate how much you would like to use and staple it to your student's permission slip along with a note requesting the use of the ledger to pay for the field trip.
- 3. Return both to your director prior to the trip. *
 - ***Statements/requests returned after the trip cannot be honored***
