From the High School Podium



High School in full "swing"....

We are in the solo/ensemble season now – every high school band student is required to play either a solo or ensemble at either solo night (Tuesday, February 7, from 3:30-7pm at the high school) or at District Solo/Ensemble (Saturday, February 11 at Patrick Marsh) Students received their solo back in November and should be well on their way to having all the notes, phrasing and musicality down cold. The solo/ensemble is part of our third quarter curriculum.

We also welcome student teacher **Ms. Renee Lechner** to the Sun Prairie High School Band Department. Ms. Lechner is finishing up her degree at Edgewood College and will be with us at the High School on Mondays and Wednesdays and half days on Fridays through graduation. She is a saxophone player and has also worked a few summers as a counselor at Birch Creek Music Academy in Door County.

The **Wind Ensemble** will be going on tour all day on **Friday, March 10**th **to UW-Stevens Point**. The band will have the opportunity to work with composer David Maslanka on his composition, "Requiem." That evening we will also attend a concert of Mr. Maslanka's music at the University. We will return to Sun Prairie after the concert. **Cost is \$35**.

Further exciting news is that the **Sun Prairie High School Wind Ensemble** has been invited as one of 6 high school bands in the country to participate in a concert and day of clinics at the world famous **Carnegie Hall** in **New York City**. The event will occur on **February 12, 2018**. The day will feature a performance, clinics and master classes by members of the **Cleveland Symphony**, a private workshop by a renowned band conductor, a keynote address from Pulitzer Prize winning composer, **Michael Colgrass** and an evening performance. Cost for this opportunity February 11-14, 2018, including transportation and housing, with clinics along the way will be in the area of only \$400. Please be aware that we will need students in Wind Ensemble next year to make the commitment to attend this event.

Jazz I recorded their "Essentially Ellington" selections the week after finals as well. The band played very consistently each one of the takes. Regardless of if they make the finals or not we all learned a lot in the process. Congratulations to Jazz I on their hard work. The band recorded, "Bojangles," "It Don't Mean a Thing if it Ain't got that Swing," and "Flaming Sword". **Jazz II** recorded three selections as well for "EE," submitting them for "comments only."

Former **Juilliard** Professor and professional jazz drummer, Carl Allen worked with Jazz I prior to the recording. He had many insightful comments for the band and also played with students.

Both jazz ensembles are in preparation for the **Sun Prairie Jazz Festival** which will be held on **Saturday, February 18** at Sun Prairie High School. For the fifth consecutive year, we have been designated an "Essentially Ellington" regional festival. Both SPHS jazz bands will participate in the all-day clinic and will also perform in the evening concert. Clinicians this year are from all over the country and include **Andre Heyward** (former trombonist with the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra), **Bob Stewart** (studio Tuba player from New York), **Rick Haydon** from Southern Illinois University, **Reggie Thomas**, piano from Northern Illinois University, **David Bixler** (from New York) as well as many festival favorite clinicians. New this year is a special free performance at **2:30pm** by the **MVP Quartet** featuring **Bobby Watson** on Alto Saxophone, **Ray Drummond** on Bass, and **Marvin "Smitty" Smith** on Drums.

The **evening concert** featuring several of the bands and all of our clinicians is **open to the** public and begins at **7pm** – admission will be charged. We are concurrently running an improvisation/rhythm section clinic from 9-noon for teachers and music education students as well. **Reggie Thomas** will lead this session that will be taped by **Wisconsin Public Television**. This should be great though we will need a lot of help to make this one of the best festivals yet (We still need 20+ **volunteers** to work various shifts) – if you can help out on this day, please sign up on the volunteer calendar on the band booster website http://www.spbb.org/volunteer-calendar1.html Contact jazz chairs **Terri Lamprech** or **Cheryl Keating** if you have any questions. Volunteering at this event is a great way to share the days' excitement with your child in jazz.

We are first going to offer it up for purchase to a music family member or friend before going public with it.


Here are the details:

- 1. Ledger balances can be found on CHARMS charmsoffice.com
- 2. Ledgers are to be used within the fiscal year they are earned, no later than August 1st of the preceding school year.
- 3. All Student Ledger funds not used within the fiscal year, are transferred to SPBB General Fund on August 1 of following fiscal year.
- 4. Requests for use of Student Ledgers for below items require a 2 week notice to the treasurer (<u>treasurer@spbb.org</u>) in order to properly process the information and write a check, unless otherwise noted.
- 5. All field trip requests must have a printed statement from CHARMS showing the student's balance and the amount you would like to use from the ledger. Please staple this statement to the permission slip.

- d. Check is made out to private lesson teacher and can be picked up from CHUMS band director, Ian Melrose (ipmelro@sunprairieschools.org)

8. Band Lesson Academy

- a. Lesson teachers are SPASD Band Director approved.
- b. Maximum of \$1,000 use per fiscal year(October 1 and paid out by August 1)
- c. 2 weeks before payment is needed, log into CHARMS, and confirm your balance covers the lessons and then email lessonacademy@spbb.org with your request to use the student ledger to pay for Band Lesson Academy lessons.

Band Field Trips & How to use SPBB Fund Raisers:
